FIELD INSPECTION:

1. Acreage Fee (per acre):
 - A. Alfalfa, Clover, Corn (Open Pollinated), Cotton, Grasses, Sainfoin, Small Grains, Broomcorn, Sudangrass.....\$6.00/acre
 - B. Beans, Peas, Soybeans, Forbs, Guayule, Okra, Peanuts, Peppers.....\$6.00/acre
 - C. Sorghum, Millet.....\$6.00/acre
 - D. All Hybrids, A. B. and R. Lines (Entire Field).....\$6.00/acre
 - E. Trees, Shrubs, Native and Woody Plants.....\$80.00/Inspection
 - F. Mileage and per diem will be charged.

2. Tag Fees: \$20.00 per lot minimum on all orders.

3. All tags are \$0.60 each.

4. All field inspections completed without a tag request will be assessed a \$110/acre fee and \$0.60 per hundred weight on seed processed from the field.

Explanations:

Class Planted: Breeder, Foundation, Registered, Certified
Acreage Fee: Figured on total acreage at the rate stated above.
Field ID: Identify each field by name or numbers. This will help in maintaining the identification of the seed through growing, harvesting, and processing and may be used as the lot number of the seed.
Late Fees: \$100.00 plus expenses on all application received after the application due date.
